Pray for Global Recordings

Australia: Please pray for Blacktown Council to approve our Development Application for the new sound processing rooms and other fitout of the Prospect office/factory. We praise the Lord for a reasonably priced truck to help with our move.

Outreach in Peru: The Aventura Misionera team report there has been a revival in an area the short term mission team visited. The whole village had listened as the team preached and distributed Good News picture books and recordings on CD in the local languages. The local pastors needed encouragement to continue their local ministry, and to do outreach into nearby villages.

Bangladesh: The GRN and HELP children's home staff are doing well by the grace of God but prices are very high. Heavy rain continues, so the distribution program in the North-East has been postponed. The team continue to do research on languages needing recordings.

Outreach in Chile: Delfin, along with Frida (a lady from the Mapuche people group) visited Rapahue in southern Chile to distribute recordings in the MAPUNUNGUN language. Delfin also showed Christians how they can use GRN materials in their witness for Christ.

Kenya: Boaz Inyama recently went to Tanzania to record and to train two workers. While there he had some difficulties with passport issues, which left three recordings still to do. Pray for the Lord's purposes to be accomplished.

Philippines: Pray for good connections with the people in North-East region of Luzon. Pray for the right people to assist in translation of the gospel stories in various AGTA, ATTA and ALTA language groups. Pray for translation and recordings in 42 unrecorded target languages in the Philippines.
