Christian Education Report - June 27th 2013

Year 7: This term students have been coming to understand the Bible as God's Word and the message of salvation it brings. Lessons have covered creation, sin and are now considering our salvation. A handful of year 7 students have been participants in the recess and lunchtime groups. Plans are underway for more of these opportunities for them next term.

Year 8: Students have concluded their topic area on comparative religions and are now focusing on how religion should affect their everyday lives through studies on prayer, Worry, trust and others that will continue into term 3.

Year 9: This term year 9 looked at God's guidance and our choices through case studies of the prophet Jonah and Queen Esther. They learnt of God's mercy and forgiveness as well as His power and authority. As they finish their formal RE lessons students have also taken part in a survey to aid future lessons and follow-up.

Other PGHS groups: Year 9 students have dominated the Wednesday lunchtime group, regularly participating in the studies on the books of Ruth and now James. The Thursday recess group led by the Year 10 students has started well and continues to draw a crowd as they aim to be honest about their faith and the struggles they face like fears, family hardships and many other topics. Plans are underway for another group on Tuesday particularly targeting years 7 and 8.

Oatley: The Oatley Campus lunchtime group continues to have a core group of committed Christians who occasionally stand up to lead the group. Compared to the number of students within the Campus, the group remains small and so focus has been on how they can be witnesses for Jesus making a positive impact on their campus.

GRC Camp: Camp was held at Telford Youthworks site from Friday afternoon June 14th till Sunday afternoon June 16th across the middle School Campuses, 30 students attended and learnt more about what Jesus was like. A few students acknowledged that they needed to make a decision for Jesus themselves and were willing to 'open the door' for him. Follow up continues for all students that went on camp.

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
