

In the month of February, we welcomed new students into our campus. We set up a stall at UTS Insearch (pre-uni foundation) during their orientation week, in the first week of February. We praise God that about 20 or so students signed up to be part of FOCUS at Credo. We also got about 30+ new contacts from UTS orientation week which happened just last week. About close to 70 people came to FOCUS welcome dinner last week from countries such as China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, Myanmar, Mexico, Japan, Philippines, Cambodia and Turkey. We are praying that they can continue to come and learn this semester from the gospel of Mark as we teach in our Public Talk and Small Group Bible study.

We also thank God for raising up student leaders to serve at FOCUS. We praise God for their eagerness for the gospel to be proclaimed amongst international students at UTS. This semester we have 8 student leaders serving in both the network of FOCUS and Bible study groups. Three of them are from Indonesia and the rest are from China and Australia. At the moment we also thank God for providing three staff on the ground for FOCUS, two full time and one volunteer. Please pray that we can work together in unity for his kingdom's sake.

Please pray as we head up to Easter, for Credo annual camp, ETC. We are praying that each of the leader and staff can successfully invite an international student, so we hope and pray that we can have 22 people for the Simple English strand in the camp. Please pray that the rest of Credo will be able to learn about the doctrine of the Holy Spirit.
