

Pray for Nigeria

With today's baptism of Clinton and Jane's baby, Clara, and their imminent return to Nigeria, it is important to pray for their country. **Open Doors** gives us the following information:

Things have gone from bad to worse in Nigeria. Jumping to the 10th spot on the *Open Doors World Watch List* for the first time ever this year, Nigeria saw its greatest attack to date- with several other attacks following in suit already this year. Kidnapping hundreds of school girls and selling some of them off in marriage. Attacking an average of 5 churches each Sunday. Killing up to 2,000 people in a single attack. It's hard to imagine that a group could be so ruthless. Yet, their leader promises the worst is yet to come: *"This is just the beginning of the killings. What you've just witnessed is a tip of the iceberg. More deaths are coming,"* said Boko Haram's leader, Abubakar Shekau. As the Nigerian election draws near, more attacks are promised.

The situation has gotten so bad, that the electoral commission in Nigeria has postponed the February 14th presidential election by six weeks over concerns about the security situation in the country. Nigeria is facing a crisis as they never have before. And Christians are the target of these attacks.

Please not only pray for these believers, but pray that God will change the heart of Abubakar Shekau- that he too would come to know Christ as his Saviour.
