


From Rev Phill's Desk

I am praying that 2022 will be the year that we thrive as God's people. I recently reread Dietrich Bonhoffer's Life Together. Over this month, I want to share some insights from this book.

Bonhoffer maintains that Christian community is spirit initiated. It is not a community of our own making. Our attempts fail in the wake of power





Our community is clearly important to God. This means it should be important to us.

Gathering together is a natural part of belonging to God's family. We do not want to become estranged. And so, let me encourage you all to meet face to face once again and enjoy Christian community.
